Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update

Dear Resident / Representative:

The Veterans Home continues efforts to prevent the spread and impact of the coronavirus. The safety and wellbeing of all residents is our top priority. The Infection Prevention and Control Committee meets regularly to respond to our current situation, review new guidance, and work closely with our health department contacts.

We had no residents, and one staff test positive this past week. Since January 1, 2023, we have had no residents and two staff test positive at least once.

Symptomatic residents will continue to be tested along with residents exposed to someone with COVID-19, residents returning from a furlough or hospitalization after more than 24 hours, any resident if required prior to medical appointments or hospital procedures, and any resident as required for any reason. You will be notified of all positive results.

The COVID transmission level in Chenango County is substantial. Visitors, volunteers, and contractors must continue to screen and provide proof of testing before entering the Home. Infection Control and Prevention measures must still be followed at all times.

We are monitoring staff and residents with gastrointestinal illnesses, rhinovirus, norovirus, and a variety of other infections. The flu has also become prevalent in the community. Please consider getting a flu shot. Please pay attention to precaution signs when visiting and follow the directions. They will help protect you and others.
