Mystery Patient Drills

NYC Health and Hospitals is conducting Zika mystery patient drills, and are seeking volunteers to play patients infected with Zika. The purpose of this drill series is to assess NYC Health + Hospitals Zika screening and testing guidance.

Criteria for volunteers: We are seeking male and female volunteers meeting the description below:

Male – any age range. Will be expected to play the role of potential sexual transmission of Zika or local transmission by travel to an area with Zika transmission.

Female – between the ages of 18 to 50 years of age. Will be expected to play the role of a pregnant patient, 12-18 weeks along in simulated pregnancy (there will be no need to simulate the pregnancy belly).
