STATEMENT

OF

CHARGES

DAGOBERTO RODRIGUEZ, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about July 20, 2016, by the issuance of license number 285783 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS


- A. On or about October 7, 2021, the Oregon Medical Board (hereinafter, "Oregon Board"), issued a Stipulated Order in which Respondent withdrew his application for an Oregon medical license and agreed never to re-apply for medical licensure in Oregon. This disciplinary action was based on findings, which Respondent neither admitted nor denied, that he practiced medicine in Oregon without an Oregon medical license.
- B. The Conduct resulting in the Oregon Board's disciplinary action against Respondent would constitute misconduct under the laws of New York State pursuant to the following Section of New York State Law:
1. New York Education Law § 6530(16) (A willful or grossly negligent failure to comply with substantial provisions of federal, state, or local laws, rules, or regulations governing the practice of medicine).

SPECIFICATION OF CHARGES
HAVING BEEN FOUND GUILTY OF PROFESSIONAL MISCONDUCT

Respondent is charged with committing professional misconduct as defined in N.Y. Educ. Law § 6530(9)(b) by having been found guilty of improper professional practice or professional misconduct by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state where the conduct upon which the finding was based would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state (namely N.Y. Educ. Law §§ 6530(16)) as alleged in the facts of the following:
