That on or about June 14, 1950, I was licensed to practice
as a physician in the State of New York, having been issued
License No. 070171 by the New York State Education Department.

I understand that the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with two specifications of professional misconduct.

A copy of the Statement of Charges is annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit A.

I do not contest the first specification as it relates to paragraphs A and A.1 and B and B.1 in full satisfaction of the charges against me. However, I do not admit the first specification as it relates to A and A.1 and B and B.1.

I hereby agree that my license be restricted to prohibit the clinical practice of medicine. However, such limitation shall not be construed to prohibit the conduct of physical examinations

by me for the purpose of disability determination assessments, health assessments, pre-employment physical assessments, return to work assessments, Department of Transportation and Health assessements.

I have voluntarily restricted my practice to conform with the limitation of my license requested in this application.

I hereby make this application to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct (the Board) and request that it be granted.

I understand that, in the event that this application is not granted by the Board, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such application shall not be used against me in any way and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the Board shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by the Board pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law. Whether or not this application is granted, nothing herein shall be construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me.

I agree that, in the event the Board grants my application, as set forth herein, an order of the Chairperson of the Board shall be issued in accordance with same.

I am making this application of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion or restraint of any kind or manner.

: CHARGES

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LEONARD BERMAN, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on June 14, 1959 by the issuance of license number 070171 by the New York State Education Department.

#### FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- A. Respondent treated Patient A (patients are identified in the attached appendix) from on or about June 1, 1990, to on or about June 18, 1990, at the Buffalo General Hospital, Buffalo, N.Y. (BGH). Respondent's care and treatment of Patient A failed to meet acceptable standards of medical care, in that:
  - 1. Respondent failed to return Patient A to surgery to repair a necrotic colostomy in a timely manner.
- B. Respondent treated Patient B from on or about April 10, 1985 to on or about April 19, 1985 at the BGH. Respondent's care and treatment of Patient B failed to meet acceptable standards of medical care, in that:

- 1. Respondent improperly introduced an endoscope into the patient's throat.
- C. Respondent treated Patient C at the BGH from on or about October 10, 1989 to on or about November 3, 1989 for alcoholic liver disease with ascites. Respondent's care and treatment of Patient C failed to meet acceptable standards of medical care, in that:
  - 1. Respondent failed to review a post-operative chest x-ray in a timely manner and/or failed to accurately interpret the post-operative chest x-ray.
