STATEMENT OF

CHARGES

FRANCIS MARTIN RICCA, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about July 29, 1977, by the issuance of license number 131726 by the New York State Education Department.

### FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

Between approximately October of 1994 and April of 1996, Respondent issued A. prescriptions in the names of the patients set forth in Appendix A for controlled substances including Seconal, Tuinal, Xanax. These prescriptions were purportedly, but not in fact issued for a proper medical purposes in the bona fide medical treatment of those patients.

### SPECIFICATION OF CHARGES

#### FRAUDULENT PRACTICE

Respondent is charged with committing professional misconduct as defined by N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(2)(McKinney Supp. 1997) by practicing the profession of medicine fraudulently as alleged in the facts of the following:
