I am the subject of Order No. BPMC 95-300 annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit 1. I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for an Order (henceforth "Modification"), modifying the original order with the removal of the restriction on my license which precluded me from practicing surgery in the State of New York. This application to modify the prior order is based upon the fact that I do not intend to return to medical practice in the State of New York, and upon the understanding that this modification order will be a revision of the original order's sanction. STATEMENT OF CHARGES

DIVAKAR REDDY KRISHNAREDDY, M.D.

Divakar Reddy Krishnareddy, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about April 21, 1978, by the issuance of license number 134219 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

On or about July 5, 1994, Respondent, in a Stipulation and Decision of the Α. Medical Board of California (the Board), admitted that each of the allegations in the accusation against him was true, and that cause existed to impose discipline against him. The allegations were, inter alia, that he had practiced medicine with gross negligence, repeated negligence, and incompetence, with regard to two patients, in violation of Sections 2234(b), (c) and (d) of the California Business and Professions Code, based on the following: (1) As a result of Respondent's mismanagement of the bipolar type hip replacement surgery and insertion of a prosthesis, which he performed upon the patient, Walentina Z, the patient had an excessive amount of leg lengthening which may have also been the cause of her sciatic nerve damage and postoperative foot drop. (2) Despite the need to explore patient, John M's right L4-5 disc, Respondent, at the time that he performed a decompression lumbar laminectomy and foraminatomy, explored the patient's left L4-5 disc. As a result of Respondent's failure to explore the patient's L4-5 disc on the



correct side, and his failure to catch his own error, this patient had to undergo additional surgery (by another physician) to correct his condition.

B. On or about October 13, 1994, the Board, in the aforesaid Stipulation and Decision of the Board, ordered that Respondent's Physician's and Surgeon's license be revoked, but that the revocation be stayed and Respondent be placed on probation for five years with the following conditions: Respondent was to, *inter alia*, (1) pay \$5,000 as the costs of investigation and prosecution of the accusation, (2) within 30 days of the effective date of the order, take and pass an oral clinical exam in orthopedics, (3) not practice medicine until he passed the aforesaid exam, (4) have his practice monitored by another physician, and (5) take 25 hours per year (for each year of his probation) of additional CME than is required for relicensure.

SPECIFICATION OF CHARGES

FIRST SPECIFICATION

HAVING HAD DISCIPLINARY ACTION TAKEN

Respondent is charged with committing professional misconduct as defined in N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(9)(d)(McKinney Supp. 1995) by having his or her license to practice medicine revoked, suspended or having other disciplinary action taken, or having his or her application for a license refused, revoked or suspended or having voluntarily or otherwise surrendered his or her license after a disciplinary action was instituted by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state, where the conduct resulting in the revocation, suspension or other disciplinary action

involving the license or refusal, revocation or suspension of an application for a license or the surrender of the license would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state (namely N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(3), (4), and/or (5)) as alleged in the facts of the following:
