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ERIC G. STIER, D.O., says:

On or about July 11, 1980, I was licensed to practice medicine as a physician in the State of New York having been issued License No. 142857 by the New York State Education Department. My address is 891 Olentangy Road, Franklin Lakes, New Jersey 07417.

I understand that I have been charged with one (1) specification of professional misconduct as set forth in the Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A."

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for an agreement to allow me to surrender my license as a physician in the State of New York and request that the Board issue this Surrender Order.

I do not contest the one (1) specification set forth in the Statement of Charges.


I understand that, in the event that this proposed agreement is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such proposed agreement shall not be used against me in any

way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that in the event the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct agrees with my proposal, this Order shall be issued striking my name from the roster of physicians in the State of New York without further notice to me. I agree that this Order shall be effective upon issuance by the Board, which may be accomplished by mailing, by first class mail, a copy of the Order to me at the address set forth above, or to my attorney, or upon transmission via facsimile to me or my attorney, whichever is earliest.


I am making this agreement of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion, or restraint of any kind or manner.



ORDER



OF
CHARGES

ERIC G. STIER, D.O., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York state on July 11, 1980 by the issuance of license number 142857 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

A. On or about January 6, 2000, in the New Jersey Department of Law and Public Safety, Division of Consumer Affairs, State Board of Medical Examiners (hereinafter, "New Jersey Board") by a Consent Order of Voluntary Surrender of License (hereinafter, "New Jersey Order"), accepted Respondent's license surrender, based on a relapse into the abuse of cocaine.

B. The conduct referred to in Paragraph A constitutes misconduct under the laws of New York state, pursuant to the following sections of New York state Law:

1. New York Education Law §6530(8) (being dependent on or a habitual user of narcotics); and/or

2. New York Education Law §6530(16) (failure to comply with federal, state, or local laws, rules, or regulations governing the practice of medicine).

SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York State Education Law §6530(9)(d) by reason of having surrendered his license or having had disciplinary action taken, after a disciplinary action was instituted by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state, where the conduct resulting in the surrender or other disciplinary action would, if committed in New York State, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York State, in that the Petitioner charges:

1. The facts in paragraphs A and/or B.
