That on or about June 12, 1981, I was licensed to practice as a physician in the State of New York, having been issued License No. 146266 by the New York State Education Department.

My current address is P. O. Box 1044, Alpine, N.J. 07620, and I will advise the Director of the Office of Professional Medical Conduct of any change of my address.

I understand that the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with one specification of professional misconduct.

A copy of the Statement of Charges is annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A".

I admit guilt to the specification of professional misconduct, in full satisfaction of the charges against me. I hereby agree that my New York medical license be suspended for six (6) months, that the suspension be stayed.

I hereby make this Application to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct (the Board) and request that it be granted.

I understand that, in the event that this Application is not granted by the Board, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such

Application shall not be used against me in any way and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the Board shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by the Board pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that, in the event the Board grants my Application, as set forth herein, an order of the Chairperson of the Board shall be issued in accordance with same.

I am making this Application of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion or restraint of any kind or manner. In consideration of the value to me of the acceptance by the Board of this Application, allowing me to resolve this matter without the various risks and burdens of a hearing on the merits, I knowingly waive any right I may have to contest the Consent Order for which I hereby apply, whether administratively or judicially, and ask that the Application be granted.

**STATEMENT  
OF  
CHARGES**

EUN HO SHEEN, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about June 12, 1981, by the issuance of license number 146266 by the New York State Education Department.

**FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS**

- A. In or about July and October, 1994 Respondent treated Patient A at New York Medical Group, 2300 Westchester Avenue, Bronx, New York.
1. Respondent failed to maintain a complete and accurate medical record of her care and evaluation of Patient A.

**SPECIFICATION OF CHARGES**

Respondent is charged with committing professional misconduct as defined in N.Y. Educ. Law Sec. 6530(32)(McKinney Supp. 1996), by failing to maintain a record for each patient which accurately reflects the evaluation and treatment of the patient, as alleged in the facts of:
