JUDGE ARMON: This should be a separate transcript that I've asked that will be expedited so that the recommendation of the committee can be promptly submitted to the commissioner pursuant to the statute for her ultimate decision to continue, or not, the suspension.

I just want to put on the record first, again, why it was my recommendation to the hearing committee that they have the authority to make this determination I believe it's under the statute. unclear in the situation that we face where the 90 days are about to expire on, I think, January 13th without a waiver of the 90-day period. committee was given the alternative of making a determination without the full imminent danger case of respondent being presented in order to make that determination before the expiration of the order. Otherwise,

there had to be no authority to make a recommendation once the order expired.

Having said that --

MR. TABAK: Having said that, may I just take exception with that ruling --

JUDGE ARMON: Yes.

MR. TABAK: -- and still state that respondent should be given an opportunity to call additional witnesses with regard to this imminent danger part of the case, just as Mr. Donovan stated something in his closing remarks that the respondent has the burden of coming forward with regard to issues with respect to imminent danger. And other than for Dr. Desai, we have not had an opportunity to call additional witnesses, not only the expert, but additional witnesses with respect to that issue.
