STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Bhuma Srinivasan, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about February 1, 1995, by the issuance of license number 198397, by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- A. On or about March 17, 1995, the State of New Jersey, Department of Law & Public Safety, Division of Consumer Affairs, Board of Medical Examiners (the Board), in a Consent Order Granting Licensure, found that Respondent had provided false and misleading information in her application for licensure.
- B. On or about March 17, 1995, the Board reprimanded Respondent for engaging in an act of dishonesty in violation of N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(b), and ordered her to enroll in and successfully complete the PrOBE ethics course offered by the Board of Medical Examiners within one year of the entry date of the Board's Order.

SPECIFICATION OF CHARGES

FIRST SPECIFICATION HAVING HAD DISCIPLINARY ACTION TAKEN

Respondent is charged with committing professional misconduct as defined in N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(9)(d)(McKinney Supp. 1995) by having his or her license to
