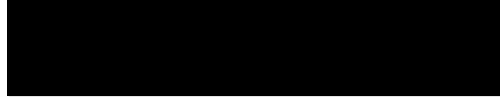

If your license or registration certificate is lost, misplaced or its whereabouts is otherwise unknown, you shall submit an affidavit to that effect. If subsequently you locate the requested items, they must then be delivered to the Office of Professional Medical Conduct in the manner noted above.

This exhausts all administrative remedies in this matter [PHL §230-c(5)].

In this proceeding pursuant to New York Public Health Law (PHL) § 230-c  
(4)(a)(McKinney 2017), the ARB dismisses the Respondent's Notice of Review for failure to  
perfect the Notice by filing a timely review brief.

Following the Respondent's Federal criminal conviction for accepting illegal kickbacks  
and bribes from a diagnostic testing company, a BPMC Hearing Committee found that the  
Respondent's criminal conduct amounted to professional misconduct. In a decision on February  
3, 2017, that Committee voted to revoke the Respondent's license to practice medicine in New  
York State. The Respondent then filed a February 23, 2017 Notice requesting administrative  
review pursuant to PHL § 230-c. Under the provisions at PHL § 230-c(4)(a), parties have thirty  
days from service of the Notice to file briefs with the ARB and the Notice shall only be perfected  
if a brief is submitted timely.

The Administrative Officer for the ARB advised the parties by letter on February 24,  
2017 that briefs would be due in this matter on March 24, 2017. Petitioner's counsel contacted  
the Administrative Officer and the Respondent by electronic mail on March 27, 2017 to

determine if the Respondent filed a brief electronically with the ARB on March 24<sup>th</sup>. The Respondent's former counsel contacted the Administrative Officer and Petitioner on March 28, 2017 to advise that the Respondent would not be filing a brief.

The ARB now rules that the Respondent has failed to perfect the Review Notice.

ORDER

NOW, with this Determination as our basis, the ARB renders the following ORDER:

The ARB dismisses the Respondent's Review Notice.

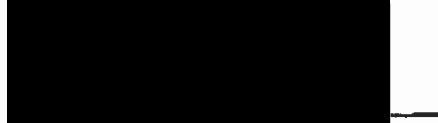
