


Upon the application of Scott English, M.D. (Respondent) for Consent Order, which application is made a part hereof, it is

Scott English, M.D., being duly sworn, deposes and says:

That on or about June 30, 1986, I was licensed to practice as a physician in the State of New York, having been issued License No. 166507, by the New York State Education Department.

My current address is 168-55 NE 2nd Avenue, Suite 202, North Miami Beach, Florida 33162, and I will advise the Director of the Office of Professional Medical Conduct of any change of my address.

I understand that the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with one specification of professional misconduct.

A copy of the Statement of Charges is annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A".

I admit guilt to the first specification, in full satisfaction of the charges against me. I hereby agree to an order that I shall pay a fine in the amount of one thousand (\$1,000) dollars, which I agree to pay within fifteen (15) days of the effective date of the Consent Order. I further agree to an order that I shall attend and complete five hours of Continuing Medical Education (CME), which do not have to be attended in the State of New York; these five hours of CME will be in addition to the twenty-two hours of CME which were required pursuant to the disciplinary action against me in Florida. I further agree to an order that I shall provide proof, that I have completed the aforesaid five hours of CME, to the


Director of the Office of Professional Medical Conduct, within thirty days of said completion.

I hereby make this Application to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct (the Board) and request that it be granted.

I understand that, in the event that this Application is not granted by the Board, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such Application shall not be used against me in any way and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the Board shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by the Board pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that, in the event the Board grants my Application, as set forth herein, an order of the Chairperson of the Board shall be issued in accordance with same.

I am making this Application of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion or restraint of any kind or manner.



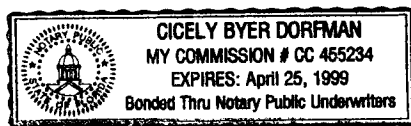



STATEMENT  
OF  
CHARGES

SCOTT ENGLISH, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about June 30, 1986, by the issuance of license number 166507 by the New York State Education Department. Respondent is not currently registered to practice medicine in the State of New York.

**SPECIFICATION OF CHARGES**

**FIRST SPECIFICATION**

**HAVING HAD DISCIPLINARY ACTION  
TAKEN AGAINST HIM BY ANOTHER STATE**

Respondent is charged with committing professional misconduct as defined in N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(9)(d) (McKinney Supp. 1995) in that he has had disciplinary action taken against him by another state, based upon conduct which would constitute misconduct as defined by N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(32) (McKinney Supp. 1995), specifically:

On or about March 2, 1994, in a Consent Agreement ("Agreement"), Respondent admitted that the facts set forth in the Administrative Complaint, if proven, would have constituted violations of Chapter 458, Florida Statutes, as alleged in the Administrative Complaint. The allegations against him were that

on or about September 1, 1990, when Respondent examined Patient #1, who was complaining of chest pains, Respondent failed to (1) address and/or document this patient's risk factors for cardiac disease and/or the character, duration, radiation and intensity of his pain, (2) correctly read this patient's EKG (which Respondent ordered), (3) record an interpretation of the EKG on the emergency room report, and (4) document justification for discharging this patient rather than admitting him for further observation and consultation. (The patient was found dead at home on the following day.)

On or about April 25, 1994, the Board of Medicine of the State of Florida ordered that Respondent (1) pay a fine in the amount of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000), and (2) attend ten hours of Continuing Medical Education in the area of Risk Management and an eight hour course in medical record keeping.
