Dear Parties:

Enclosed please find the Determination and Order (No. 19-308) of the Hearing Committee in the above referenced matter. This Determination and Order shall be deemed effective upon the receipt or seven (7) days after mailing by certified mail as per the provisions of §230, subdivision 10, paragraph (h) of the New York State Public Health Law.

Five days after receipt of this Order, you will be required to deliver to the Board of Professional Medical Conduct your license to practice medicine together with the registration certificate. Delivery shall be by either certified mail or in person to:

Office of Professional Medical Conduct New York State Department of Health Office of Professional Medical Conduct Riverview Center 150 Broadway - Suite 355 Albany, New York 12204

If your license or registration certificate is lost, misplaced or its whereabouts is otherwise unknown, you shall submit an affidavit to that effect. If subsequently you locate the requested items, they must then be delivered to the Office of Professional Medical Conduct in the manner noted above.

As prescribed by the New York State Public Health Law §230, subdivision 10, paragraph (i), (McKinney Supp. 2015) and §230-c subdivisions 1 through 5, (McKinney Supp. 2015), "the determination of a committee on professional medical conduct may be reviewed by the Administrative Review Board for professional medical conduct." Either the licensee or the Department may seek a review of a committee determination.

Request for review of the Committee's determination by the Administrative Review Board stays penalties <u>other than suspension or revocation</u> until final determination by that Board. Summary orders are not stayed by Administrative Review Board reviews.

All notices of review must be served, by certified mail, upon the Administrative Review Board and the adverse party within fourteen (14) days of service and receipt of the enclosed Determination and Order.

The notice of review served on the Administrative Review Board should be forwarded to:

The parties shall have 30 days from the notice of appeal in which to file their briefs to the Administrative Review Board. Six copies of all papers must also be sent to the attention of Mr. Horan at the above address and one copy to the other party. The stipulated record in this matter shall consist of the official hearing transcript(s) and all documents in evidence.

Parties will be notified by mail of the Administrative Review Board's Determination and Order.

DETERMINATION

AND

ORDER 19-308

This case was brought by the New York State Department of Health, Bureau of Professional Medical Conduct ("the Department"). A Commissioner's Order of Summary Action ("COSA"), Notice of Referral Proceeding ("NORP") and Statement of Charges ("SOC"), all dated August 21, 2019, were served upon Ramil Mansourov, M.D. ("Respondent"), The COSA, NORP and SOC are attached to this Determination and Order as Appendix 1. A hearing, pursuant to N.Y. Public Health Law ("PHL") §230 and New York State Admin. Proc. Act §§301-307 and 401, was held on October 23, 2019, at the Department's offices at 90 Church Street, New York, New York.

C. Deborah Cross, M.D., Chair, David M. Kirshy, M.D., and Michael Colon, Esq., duly designated members of the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, served as the Hearing Committee ("Committee") in this matter. Ann H. Gayle, Administrative Law Judge, served as the administrative officer. The Department appeared by Marc S. Nash, Associate Counsel. Respondent, having been duly served with the COSA, NORP and SOC in conformity with the requirements of PHL §230.10(d), did not appear (Exhibit 2). Evidence was received and a transcript (pages 1-17) of this hearing was made. The record closed November 14, 2019, when the transcript was received.

After consideration of the entire record, the Committee issues this Determination and Order. All findings, conclusions, determinations and orders herein are unanimous.

STATEMENT OF CASE

This case was brought pursuant to PHL §230(10)(p) which provides for a hearing with circumscribed issues when a licensee is charged with misconduct based upon a criminal conviction under federal or state law and/or upon an administrative adjudication in another state regarding conduct that would amount to a crime and/or professional misconduct if committed in New York. N.Y. Education Law ("Educ. Law") §6530(9). The scope of the hearing is limited to a determination of the penalty, if any, to be imposed upon the licensee. In the instant case, Respondent is charged with professional misconduct pursuant to Educ. Law §6530(9)(a)(ii) for having been convicted of a crime under federal law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Citations in parentheses refer to transcript page numbers ("T") and exhibits ("Ex").

- On August 27, 2019, Respondent was personally served with a COSA, NORP and SOC;
 he did not appear at the hearing in person or by a representative. (Ex 2; T 5-6)
- Respondent was authorized by the New York State Education Department to practice medicine in New York State on January 18, 2008, by the issuance of license number 247350. The current status of Respondent's license is "summary suspension." (Ex 3; T 6-7)
- 3. On September 17, 2018, Respondent entered into a plea agreement with the United States in the U.S. District Court for the District of Connecticut, in which he agreed to forfeit Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars in United States currency. Respondent also pled to, and was adjudicated guilty of, one count of Health Care Fraud, in violation of 18 USC §1347, and one count of Laundering Money Instruments, in violation of 18 USC §1956(a)(1)(B). Respondent was sentenced to 87 months imprisonment on both counts to run concurrently,

ordered to pay criminal monetary penalties consisting of a special assessment of \$200.00 and restitution of \$4,994,027.00. Upon release, Respondent is to be on supervised release for 36 months and he is to participate in a mental health treatment program as well as a substance abuse treatment program. On March 20, 2019, a Final Order of Forfeiture-Money Judgment was issued against Respondent in the amount of \$50,000.00. (Ex 4; Ex 5; T 10, 11)

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Department charged Respondent with one Specification of professional misconduct pursuant to Educ. Law §6530(9)(a)(ii) for having been convicted of a crime under federal law.

The Committee concludes that this Specification is sustained based on Respondent's conviction in the Judgment in a Criminal Case filed March 21, 2019 (Ex 4).

DETERMINATION AS TO PENALTY

The Committee considered the full range of penalties available pursuant to PHL Law §230-a, including: (1) censure and reprimand; (2) suspension of the license, wholly or partially; (3) limitation on practice; (4) revocation of the license; (5) annulment of the license or registration; (6) limitation on registration or further licensure; (7) monetary penalties; (8) a course of education or training; (9) performance of public service; and, (10) probation.

The Committee finds that Respondent's felony convictions for Health Care Fraud and Laundering of Money Instruments, related to the practice of medicine, demand a revocation as it is the only appropriate penalty to address Respondent's very serious misconduct.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. The charge of misconduct under Educ. Law §6530(9)(a)(ii) for having been convicted of a crime under federal law is SUSTAINED.

- 2. Pursuant to PHL §230-a(4) Respondent's license to practice medicine shall be REVOKED.
- 3. This order shall be effective upon service on the Respondent by personal service or by certified mail as required under PHL §230(10)(h).


The undersigned, Sally Dreslin, M.S., R.N., Executive Deputy Commissioner, pursuant to N.Y. Public Health Law §230, upon the recommendation of a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct of the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, has determined that Ramil Mansourov, M.D. (henceforth "Respondent"), New York license number 247350, has pleaded or been found guilty or convicted of committing an act constituting a felony under New York State law, federal law, or the law of another jurisdiction which, if committed within this state, would have constituted a felony under New York State law, as is more fully set forth in the Statement of Charges attached to the Notice of Referral Proceeding or Notice of Hearing and made a part hereof.

It is therefore:

ORDERED, pursuant to N.Y. Public Health Law §230(12)(b), that effective immediately, Respondent shall not practice medicine in the State of New York, or practice in any setting under the authority of Respondent's New York Ilcense.

Any practice of medicine in violation of this Order shall constitute Professional Misconduct within the meaning of N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(29) and may constitute unauthorized medical practice, a Felony defined by N.Y. Educ. Law §6512.

This Order shall remain in effect until the final conclusion of a hearing which shall commence within ninety days of the service of this order and shall end within ninety days thereafter. The hearing will be held pursuant to the provisions of N.Y. Pub. Health Law.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT:

An adjudicatory proceeding will be held pursuant to the provisions of N.Y. Pub. Health Law §230(10)(p) and N.Y. State Admin. Proc. Act §§301-307 and 401. The proceeding will be conducted before a committee on professional conduct of the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct (Committee) on October 23, 2019 at 10:30 a.m., at the offices of the New York State Department of Health, 90 Church Street, 4th Floor, New York, NY 10007, and at such other adjourned dates, times and places the committee may direct.

At the proceeding, evidence will be received concerning the allegations set forth in the Statement of Charges, which is attached. A stenographic record of the proceeding will be made and the witnesses at the proceeding will be sworn and examined.

You may appear in person at the proceeding and may be represented by counsel who shall be an attorney admitted to practice in New York state. You may produce evidence or sworn testimony on your behalf. Such evidence or sworn testimony shall be strictly limited to evidence and testimony relating to the nature and severity of the penalty to be imposed upon the licensee. Where the charges are based on the conviction of state law crimes in other jurisdictions, evidence may be offered which would show that the conviction would not be a crime in New York State. The Committee also may limit the number of witnesses whose testimony will be received, as well as the length of time any witness will be permitted to testify.

If you intend to present sworn testimony, the number of witnesses and an estimate of the time necessary for their direct examination must be submitted to the New York State Department of Health, Division of Legal Affairs, Bureau of Adjudication, Riverview Center, 150

Broadway - Suite 510, Albany, NY 12204-2719, ATTENTION: HON. JAMES HORAN, DIRECTOR, BUREAU OF ADJUDICATION (Telephone: (518-402-0748), (henceforth "Bureau of Adjudication") as well as the Department of Health attorney indicated below, no later than twenty days prior to the scheduled date of the Referral Proceeding, as indicated above.

Pursuant to the provisions of N.Y. Pub. Health Law §230(10)(p), you shall file a written answer to each of the charges and allegations in the Statement of Charges at least ten days prior to the date of the hearing. Any charge or allegation not so answered shall be deemed admitted. You may wish to seek the advice of counsel prior to filing such answer. You may also file a written brief and affidavits with the Committee. All such documents shall be filed with the Bureau of Adjudication, at the address indicated above, and a copy shall be forwarded to the attorney for the Department of Health whose name appears below, at least ten days prior to the date of the hearing. Should the parties have objection(s) to proposed witnesses or documentary evidence, the party raising the objection(s) shall contact the Bureau of Adjudication at least three days prior to the hearing date to arrange for a pre-hearing conference with the Administrative Law Judge, prior to the hearing date.

Not later than ten days prior to the date of the hearing, you are required to file one copy of your proposed exhibits (if any) with the Bureau of Adjudication at the address indicated above, and a copy of all such documents/exhibits must be served on the same date on the Department of Health attorney indicated below. On the day of the hearing, you are also required to provide the original of such exhibits and three copies, for use by the Committee.

Pursuant to §301(5) of the State Administrative Procedure Act, the Department, upon reasonable notice, will provide at no charge a qualified interpreter of the deaf to interpret the proceedings to, and the testimony of, any deaf person. Pursuant to the terms of N.Y. State Admin. Proc. Act §401 and 10 N.Y.C.R.R. §51.8(b), the Petitioner hereby demands disclosure of the evidence that the Respondent intends to introduce at the hearing, including the names of witnesses, a list of and copies of documentary evidence and a description of physical or other evidence which cannot be photocopied.

YOU ARE HEREBY ADVISED THAT THE ATTACHED CHARGES WILL BE MADE PUBLIC FIVE BUSINESS DAYS AFTER THEY ARE SERVED.

The proceeding may be held whether or not you appear. Please note that requests for adjournments must be made in writing to the Bureau of Adjudication, at the address indicated above, with a copy of the request to the attorney for the Department of Health, whose name appears below, at least five days prior to the scheduled date of the proceeding. Adjournment requests are not routinely granted. Claims of court engagement will require detailed affidavits of actual engagement. Claims of illness will require medical documentation. Failure to obtain an attorney within a reasonable period of time prior to the proceeding will not be grounds for an adjournment.

The Committee will make a written report of its findings, conclusions as to guilt, and a determination. Such determination may be reviewed by the administrative review board for professional medical conduct.

RAMIL MANSOUROV, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine In New York State on or about January 18, 2008, by the issuance of license number 247350 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

A. On or about March 18, 2019, the Respondent pled guilty in the U.S. District Court for the District of Connecticut to one count of Health Care Fraud (18 USC § 1347) and one count of Laundering Money Instruments (18 USC § 1956(a)(1)(B)). The Respondent was sentenced to 87 months imprisonment on both counts to run concurrently, ordered to pay criminal monetary penalties consisting of a special assessment of \$200.00 and restitution of \$4,994,027.00. Upon release, the Respondent is to be on supervised release for 36 months and to participate in a mental health treatment program as well as a substance abuse treatment program. On or about March 20, 2019, a Final Order of Forfeiture-Money Judgment was issued against the Respondent in the amount of \$50,000.00.
