Upon the Application of SHASHI GANTI, M.D. (Respondent) to Surrender his/her license as a physician in the State of New York, which application is made a part hereof, it is


ORDERED, that the application and the provisions thereof are hereby adopted; it is further

I hereby make this application to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct and request that it be granted.


I understand that, in the event that the application is not granted by the State

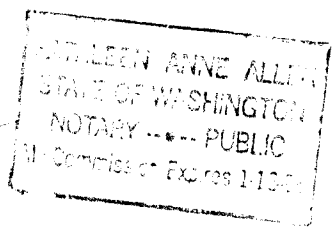

**STATEMENT
OF
CHARGES**

SHASHI GANTI, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State by the issuance of license number 162239 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- A. By an Order of the Medical Board of California, Division of Medical Quality, issued on May 12, 1995, effective June 12, 1995, Respondent's license to practice medicine in that State was revoked. The California order was based upon a finding that Respondent had, inter alia, had committed sexual assault and gross negligence in his care and treatment of a patient.

SPECIFICATION OF CHARGES

**SPECIFICATION

Respondent is charged with committing professional misconduct as defined in N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(9)(b)(McKinney Supp. 1995) by having been found guilty of

improper professional practice or professional misconduct by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state where the conduct upon which the finding was based would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state (namely N.Y. Educ. Law §§ 4, 20, and 31) as alleged in the facts of the following:
