I understand that, in the event that the application is not granted by the Board of Regents, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such application shall not be used against me in any way and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the Board of Regents shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by the Board of Regents pursuant to the provisions of the Education Law.

I agree that, in the event the Board of Regents grants my application, an order of the Commissioner of Education may be issued striking my name from the roster of physicians in the State of New York without further notice to me.

I further agree that the order of the Commissioner shall include a provision that I shall not apply for the restoration of my license until at least one (1) year has elapsed from the effective date of the service of such order. I understand that such application is not automatically granted but may be granted or denied.

CHARGES

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Mukalinpurathu Geevarghese, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on August 14, 1981 by the issuance of license number 147362 by the New York State Education Department. The Respondent is currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice medicine for the period January 1, 1989 through December 31, 1991 at 88 30 51st Avenue, Elmhurst, N.Y. 11373-3920.

#### Factual Allegations

A.1. From on or about October 6, 1986 through on or about October 5, 1987, Patient A (this patient and all other are identified in the attached appendix), went to Respondent for treatment at this office located at 63 W. Fordham Road Bronx, N.Y. At each of the 13 visits Respondent diagnosed Patient A as suffering from bronchial asthma without performing the necessary

physical examination and without obtaining a sufficient patient history to substantiate that diagnosis.

- A.2. At each of the 13 visits Respondent prescribed either a ventolin, proventil, or isopril inhaler without medical justification.
- A.3. On or about October 6, November 11, 1986, February 18, March 9, March 26, April 13, and April 28, 1987, Respondent prescribed valuum or elavil to Patient A without medical justification.
- B.1. From on or about March 30, 1987 through on or about August 11, 1987, Patient B went to Respondent's office for treatment. At each visit Respondent diagnosed the patient as suffering from bronchial asthma without performing the necessary physical examinations and without obtaining a sufficient patient history to substantiate that diagnosis.
- B.2. On the March 30th visit Respondent diagnosed periumbilical tenderness without performing the necessary physical examination to substantiate that diagnosis.

- B.3. At each of the four visits, Respondent prescribed alupent inhalers and flexaril to Patient B without medical justification.
- B.4. On or about March 30 and August 11, 1987, Respondent prescribed tagamet and/ or zantac to Patient B without medical justification.
- C.1. From on or about January 19, 1987 through on or about November 18, 1987, Patient C went to Respondent's office for treatment. At each of patient C's 14, visits Respondent diagnosed Patient C as suffering from bronchial asthma without performing the necessary physical examinations and without obtaining sufficient patient history to substantiate the diagnosis.
- C.2. At each of the patient's 14 visits, Respondent prescribed a proventil inhaler to Patient C without medical justification.
- C.3. From on or March 18, through November 18, 1987, Respondent prescribed flexaril to Patient C without medical justification.

- D.1. From on or about March 9, 1987 through on or about May 26 1987, Patient D went to Respondent's office for treatment. On each of the five visits Respondent diagnosed Patient D as suffering from bronchial asthma without performing the necessary physical examination and without obtaining a sufficient patient history to substantiate the diagnosis.
  - D.2. At each of the patient's five visits Respondent prescribed a proventil inhaler and flexaril to Patient D without medical justification.
  - E.1. From on or about October 6, 1986 through on or about May 28, 1937, Patient E went to Respondent's office for treatment. Respondent diagnosed Patient E as suffering from otitis externa, nervousness and insomnia without performing the necessary physical examinations and without obtaining a sufficient patient history to substantiate the diagnosis.
  - E.2. On each of the seven visits, Respondent prescribed sinequan, valium and flexaril to Patient E without medical justification.

#### SPECIFICATION

### PRACTICING MEDICINE FRAUDULENTLY

Respondent is charged with professional misconduct by reason of practicing the profession of medicine fraudulently

within the meaning of N.Y. Educ. Law Section 6509 (2) (McKinney 1985) in that Petitioner charges:

1. The facts in Paragraphs A.1 through A.3; B.1 through B.4; C.1 through C.3; D.1 through D.2; E.1 through E.2.
