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ANDREW G. GUNTHER, M.D., says:

On or about February 25,1987, I was licensed to practice medicine as a physician in the State of New York having been issued License No. 169393 by the New York State Education Department. My current address is 451 Hoosick Street, Troy, New York 12180.

I am currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice as a physician in the State of New York.

I understand that I have been charged with three specifications of professional misconduct as set forth in the Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A".

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for an agreement to allow me to surrender my license as a physician in the State of New York and request that the Board issue this Surrender Order.

I admit guilt to the allegations and the first and third specifications set forth in the Statement of Charges (Exhibit A).

I understand that, in the event that this proposed agreement is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such proposed agreement shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that in the event the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct agrees with my proposal, this Order shall be issued striking my name from the roster of physicians in the State of New York without further notice to me. I agree that this Order shall be effective upon issuance by the Board, which may be accomplished by mailing, by first class mail, a copy of the Order to me at the address set forth above, or to my attorney, or upon transmission via facsimile to me or my attorney, whichever is earliest.

Respondent wrote and/or renewed prescriptions for Valium or Lortab, or some portion thereof, in the name of patients and/or individuals other than himself when in fact the prescriptions were not given to the patient and/or to the individual named on the prescription form and/or were filled by the individuals with the medications being given to the Respondent for his own use and/or the prescriptions were filled by Respondent

for his own use.
