Report of the Regents Review Committee

LUIS ANDRES ORTIZ, hereinafter referred to as respondent, was noticed to appear in this proceeding at which he could be represented by an attorney.

On July 3, 1986 respondent did appear and was represented by an attorney, Thomas J. Mason, Esq. Jean Bresler, Esq., represented the Office of Professional Medical Conduct of the New York State Department of Health.

We have carefully reviewed and considered the entire record in this matter.

We render the following findings of fact, determination

LUIS ANDRES ORTIZ (5853)

as to guilt, and recommendation as to the penalty to be imposed.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- We find that respondent was registered to practice as a physician's assistant in the State of New York by the New York State Education Department.
- We find that the instant disciplinary proceeding was commenced by service of the notice of hearing and statement of charges upon respondent.
- 3. We find that respondent was convicted of committing an act constituting a crime, as set forth in the statement of charges annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A".

DETERMINATION AS TO GUILT

We unanimously determine that the charge has been proven by a preponderance of the evidence and that respondent is guilty of the same.

RECOMMENDATION AS TO THE PENALTY TO BE IMPOSED

We unanimously recommend to the Board of Regents that, under all of the circumstances herein, respondent's registration to practice as a physician's assistant in the State of New York be revoked upon the charge of which respondent has been found guilty.

LUIS ORTIZ, P.A.

The State Board for Professional Medical Conduct,
upon information and belief, charges and alleged as follows:

- 1. Luis Ortiz, P.A., hereinafter referred to as the Respondent, was authorized to practice as a physicians's assistant in the State of New York on October 20, 1978 by the issuance of license number PA001020 by the State Education Department.
- 2. The Respondent is currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice medicine as a physician's assistant at Apt. 1D, 228 West 62nd Street, New York, New York 10023, from the period beginning January 1, 1984 and ending December 31, 1986.
- 3. The Respondent is charged with professional misconduct within the purview of N.Y. Educ. Law §6509 (McKinney 1985) as set forth in the specification below.

SPECIFICATION

- 4. The Respondent is charged with professional misconduct within the meaning of N.Y. Educ. Law §6509(5)(a)(i)(McKinney 1985) in that he has been convicted of committing an act constituting a crime under New York State law, specifically:
 - a. On May 9, 1985, the Respondent was convicted in New York County Supreme Court, after he entered a plea of guilty to the crime of conspiracy in the Fifth Degree, Section 105.05 of the Penal Law of the State of New York, specifically conspiring to violate Title 8, Art. 130, subarticle 4, section 6512(1) of the Education Law of the State of New York and criminal possession of a forged instrument in the Second Degree.
 - b. Following his conviction the Respondent was sentenced on June 18, 1985 by Honorable Harold J. Rothwax to three years probation.



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


