On or about March 12, 1958, I was licensed to practice medicine as a physician in the State of New York having been issued License No. 080588 by the New York State Education Department.

I understand that I have been charged with one specification of professional misconduct as set forth in the Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A".

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for permission to surrender my license as a physician in the State of New York on the grounds that I agree not to contest that specification, in full satisfaction of the Statement of Charges.

I hereby make this application to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct and request that it be granted. I understand that, in the event that the application is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such application shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I am making this Application of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion or restraint of any kind or manner. ANTHONY M. PAGANO, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about March 12, 1958, by the issuance of license number 080588 by the New York State Education Department.

A. On or about March 28, 1997, Respondent surrendered his license to practice medicine in the state of California, based upon allegations that he had permitted a registered nurse under his supervision to practice medicine without a license.
