

I understand that, in the event that the application is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such application shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.



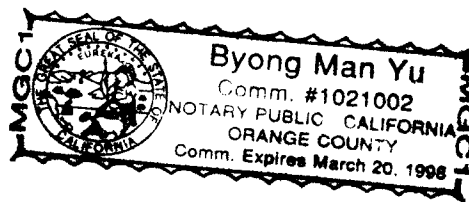

STATEMENT  
OF  
CHARGES

JANGWON PARK, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about February 16, 1979, by the issuance of license number 137329 by the New York State Education Department.

**FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS**

- A. On or about January 23, 1995, Respondent was convicted, upon a guilty plea, in the United States District Court, Central District of California, of Subscribing to False Income Tax Return in violation of 26 U.S.C. Sec. 7206(1) in that on or about April 15, 1988, in Los Angeles County, Respondent made and subscribed, by a written declaration verifying that he was doing so under penalty of perjury, and filed with the Internal Revenue Service, a form 1040 individual income tax return for calendar year 1987, which he knew and believed was not true and correct as to a material matter in that the tax return reported income of \$1,220,000; whereas, as he then knew and believed, his income was substantially in excess of \$1,220,000. Respondent was sentenced, as follows : a four year term of probation, with terms including that the first six months of probation be served in home confinement with electronic monitoring and that Respondent participate in alcohol counseling, treatment and testing as required by the Probation Officer; a \$10,000 fine ; and restitution to the Internal Revenue Service of \$444,324.

- B. On or about July 18, 1996, the Division of Medical Quality, Medical Board of California, issued a disciplinary Order accepting the surrender of Respondent's license based upon Respondent's admission that the criminal conviction alleged in paragraph A above provided cause for disciplinary action pursuant to California Business and Professions Code sections 490, 2234, subdivision (a), and 2236.

**SPECIFICATION OF CHARGES**

**FIRST SPECIFICATION**

**CRIMINAL CONVICTION (Federal)**

Respondent is charged with committing professional misconduct as defined in N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(9)(a)(ii)(McKinney Supp. 1997) by having been convicted of committing an act constituting a crime under federal law as alleged in the facts of the following:


**HAVING HAD DISCIPLINARY ACTION TAKEN**

Respondent is charged with committing professional misconduct as defined in N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(9)(d)(McKinney Supp. 1997) by having his or her license to practice medicine revoked, suspended or having other disciplinary action taken, or having his or her application for a license refused, revoked or suspended or having voluntarily or otherwise surrendered his or her license after a disciplinary action was instituted by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state, where the conduct resulting in the revocation, suspension or other disciplinary action involving the license or refusal, revocation or suspension of an application for a license or the surrender of the license would, if committed in New York state,

constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state (namely N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(9)(a)(ii)) as alleged in the facts of the following:
