
ORDERED, that the application and the provisions thereof are hereby adopted; it is further



I understand that, in the event that the application is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such application shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that, in the event the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct grants my application, an order shall be issued striking my name from the roster of physicians in the State of New York without further notice to me.


I am making this Application of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion, or restraint of any kind or manner.







**STATEMENT
OF
CHARGES**

ANEEL NATHOOBHAI PATEL, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about 1973, by the issuance of license number 118569 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- A. On or about July 31, 1994, the Respondent entered into a Consent Order with the Board of Medical Examiners of North Carolina ("Board") in which Respondent admitted that he violated North Carolina General Statute §90-14(5)(1992). A person violates this statute by having been unable to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety by reason of excessive use of alcohol. Respondent admitted to a history of abuse of alcohol.

SPECIFICATION

**HAVING BEEN FOUND GUILTY OF
PROFESSIONAL MISCONDUCT**

Respondent is charged with committing professional misconduct as defined in N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(9)(b)(McKinney Supp. 1995) by having been found guilty of improper professional practice or professional misconduct by a duly authorized

professional disciplinary agency of another state where the conduct upon which the finding was based would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state (namely N.Y. Educ. Law §§ 6530(8) (McKinney Supp. 1995) as alleged in the facts of the following:
