

I understand that, in the event that the application is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such application shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.


I agree that, in the event the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct grants my application, an order shall be issued striking my name from the roster of physicians in the State of New York without further notice to me.

STATEMENT  
OF  
CHARGES

MOORTHY S. RAM, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on October 12, 1979 by the issuance of license number 140347 by the New York State Education Department.

**FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS**

A. 1. On or about November 10, 1993, in United States District Court for the Eastern District of New York, before the Hon. Charles p. Sifton, U.S.D.J., on Case No. CR 93 1046, Respondent was arraigned on an eight count indictment charging him with criminal acts of fraud, arson, and witness tampering, based on the following federal criminal statutes:

18 U.S.C. secs. 2, 844(i), 1341, 1512(b)(1), and 3551  
et seq.

2. On or about February 15, 1994, in United States District Court for the Eastern District of New York, before the Hon. Joanna Seybert, U.S.D.J., on Case No. CR 93 1046, after a jury trial, Respondent was found guilty on all counts of the above-referenced indictment.

3. On or about September 30, 1994, in United States District Court for the Eastern District of New York, before the Hon. Joanna Seybert, U.S.D.J., on Case No. CR 93 1046, on the above-referenced indictment, Respondent was sentenced to:

60 months on Count 1;  
60 months on Count 2;  
60 months on Count 3;  
60 months on Count 4;  
60 months on Count 5;  
84 months on Count 6;  
16 months on Count 7;  
16 months on Count 8,

with the prison terms imposed to run concurrently for a total term of imprisonment of 84 months. In addition, Respondent was sentenced to a 3 year term of supervised release, upon release from imprisonment, and was fined \$25,000.00 and assessed \$400.00, all of which was to be paid immediately.

4. On November 8, 1994, Respondent was delivered to FTD East at Fort Dix, New Jersey to begin serving his term of imprisonment.

#### **CONVICTION OF ACT CONSTITUTING A CRIME UNDER FEDERAL LAW**
