

I understand that the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with One Specification of professional misconduct.

I admit guilt to the Specification, in full satisfaction of the charges against me. hereby agree to the penalty that my license to practice medicine in the State of New York be suspended for a period of one year.

I hereby make this Application to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct (the Board) and request that it be granted.

I understand that, in the event that this Application is not granted by the Board, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such Application shall not be used against me in any way and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the Board shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by the Board pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that, in the event the Board grants my Application, as set forth herein, an order of the Chairperson of the Board shall be issued in accordance with same.

I am making this Application of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion or restraint of any kind or manner.

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AUDREY CECILE SADAPHAL, the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on April 29, 1986 by the issuance of license number 166066 by the New York State Education Department. The Respondent is currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice medicine for the period January 1, 1993 through December 31, 1994 at 44 Georgia Street, N. Valley Stream, N.Y. 11580.

#### SPECIFICATION

Respondent is charged with professional misconduct within the meaning of N.Y. Educ. Law Section 6530(9)(a)(ii) (McKinney Supp. 1994), in that Respondent was convicted of committing an act constituting a crime under federal law, specifically:

> On or about May 5, 1993, Respondent was convicted, upon her plea of guilty, of one (1) count of Conspiracy to Commit Medicaid and Mail Fraud, in violation of 18 USC 1341 and 18 USC

371, in that, in or about late February 1991, through in or about May 1991, Respondent,

together with others, participated in a scheme to operate medical clinics for the purpose of obtaining payments directly and indirectly from the Medicaid system by submitting bills, and causing others to submit bills, to the New York State Department of Social Service for medical services, drug prescriptions, and laboratory tests which she knew to be, and were in fact, medically unnecessary.
