On or about August 13, 1976, I was licensed to practice as a physician in the State of New York having been issued License No. 128070 by the New York State Education Department.

I am currently registered to practice as a physician in the State of New York during the period January 1, 1993 through December 31, 1994 from 700 Linden Boulevard, Brooklyn, N.Y. 11203.

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for permission to surrender my license as a physician in the State of New York on the grounds that I admit the three specifications of professional misconduct set forth in the

Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A."

I hereby make this application to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct and request that it be granted.

I understand that, in the event that the application is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such application shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that in the event the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct grants my application, an order shall be issued striking my name from the roster of physicians in the State of New York without further notice to me.

I am making this Application of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion, or restraint of any kind or manner.

CHARGES

KIRBY WRIGHT, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on August 13, 1976 by the issuance of license number 128070 by the New York State Education Department. The Respondent is currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice medicine for the period January 1, 1993 through December 31, 1994.

#### FIRST SPECIFICATION

### HAVING BEEN CONVICTED OF AN ACT CONSTITUTING A CRIME UNDER NEW YORK STATE LAW

Respondent is charged with professional misconduct within the meaning of N.Y. Educ. Law Sec. 6530(9)(a)(i) (McKinney Supp. 1994) in that he has been convicted of committing an act constituting a crime under New York State law, specifically:

On or about February 23, 1989, the Respondent was convicted after a plea of guilty in the Supreme Court of the State of New York, County of Kings, of Offering a False Instrument for Filing in the Second Degree, a Class A misdemeanor, in violation of Section 175.30 of the Penal Law, in that from on or about March 13, 1987 to on or about March 24, 1987, the Respondent, intending to defraud the State of New York, in the County of Kings, presented a claim for payment under the Medicaid program to Computer Science Corporation, a fiscal agent for the State of New York, which claim contained false statements and information, in that it was claimed that an electrocardiogram, a spirometry examination and an intravenous injection for diagnostic study had been rendered to Medicaid recipient Margaret Brown on March 13, 1987, when Respondent knew that such service had not been provided, and that Respondent offered and presented this false Medicaid claim with the knowledge and belief that it would be filed with and become part of the records of the State and its fiscal agent.

On or about February 23, 1989, the Respondent was sentenced to a \$500 fine.

## SECOND AND THIRD SPECIFICATIONS

#### PRACTICING FRAUDULENTLY

Respondent is charged with professional misconduct within the meaning of N.Y. Educ. Law Sec. 6530(2) (McKinney Supp. 1994) in that he has practiced the profession fraudulently, specifically:

2. On or about October 28, 1991, Respondent submitted an application for reappointment to Kings County Hospital Center in which he stated falsely that he had been certified/recertified by the American Board of Family Practice until 1993 and on or about October 29, 1991, in connection with the same

reappointment application, Respondent submitted a forged certificate to Kings County Hospital Center which purported to certify that he had been certified by the American Board of Family Practice for the period 1986-1993, when he knew that such information and documentation was false and that he was not Board certified by the American Board of Family Practice for any period after 1986.

3. On or about February 26, 1992 and on or about December 1, 1992, Respondent submitted false information to the Medical Society of the State of New York stating that he was certified by the American Board of Family Practice for the purpose of having this information included in his listing in the Medical Directory of New York State when he knew that such information was false and that he was not Board certified by the American Board of Family Practice for any period after 1986.
