

I understand that, in the event that the application is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such application shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.



STATEMENT
OF
CHARGES

DEBRA RENEE WYNECOFF, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about April 23, 1984, by the issuance of license number 158017 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- A. By a Consent Order of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina dated September 17, 1993, as a result of her cocaine addiction and her then recent relapse, Respondent surrendered her license to practice in North Carolina and was granted a temporary permit to practice, subject to certain conditions and terms related to her substance abuse problems. Respondent subsequently, in January of 1995, again surrendered her North Carolina (temporary) permit. Respondent's addiction to cocaine would constitute professional misconduct as defined by N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(8)(McKinney Supp. 1995).

SPECIFICATION

HAVING HAD DISCIPLINARY ACTION TAKEN

Respondent is charged with committing professional misconduct as defined in N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(9)(d)(McKinney Supp. 1995) by having his or her license to practice medicine revoked, suspended or having other disciplinary action taken, or having his or her application for a license refused, revoked or suspended or having voluntarily or otherwise surrendered his or her license after a disciplinary action was instituted by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state, where the conduct resulting in the revocation, suspension or other disciplinary action involving the license or refusal, revocation or suspension of an application for a license or the surrender of the license would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state (namely N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(8)) as alleged in the facts of the following:
