MAGED ZAKARI YOUSSEF-AHMED, M.D., (Respondent) being duly sworn, deposes and says:

That on or about June 1, 1995, I was licensed to practice as a physician in the State of New York, having been issued License No. 119752 by the New York State Education Department.

My current address is 384 DeMott Avenue, Rockville Centre, New York 11570, and I will advise the Director of the Office of Professional Medical Conduct of any change of my address.

I understand that the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with seven specifications of professional misconduct.

A copy of the Statement of Charges is annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A".

In full satisfaction of the charges against me, I agree not to contest the first through sixth specifications, deny the seventh specification, and agree to the following:

Twenty-four months suspension, twenty months stayed (4 months of active license suspension to commence on March 1, 2000), 500 hours of community service, and two years probation as set forth in the annexed Exhibit B.

I further agree that the Consent Order for which I hereby apply shall contain the following conditions:

That, except during periods of actual suspension, Respondent shall maintain current registration of Respondent's license with the New York State Education Department Division of Professional Licensing Services, and pay all registration fees. This condition shall be in effect beginning thirty days after the effective date of the Consent Order and will continue while the licensee possesses his/her license; and

That Respondent shall fully cooperate in every respect with the Office of Professional Medical Conduct (OPMC) in its administration and enforcement of this Order. Respondent shall respond in a timely manner to each and every request by OPMC to provide written periodic verification of Respondent's compliance with the terms of this Order. Respondent shall meet with a person designated by the Director of OPMC as directed. Respondent shall respond promptly and provide any and all documents and information within Respondent's control, relevant to the enforcement of this order, upon the direction of OPMC. This condition shall be in effect beginning upon the effective date of the Consent Order and will continue during the period of probation.

I hereby stipulate that any failure by me to comply with such conditions shall constitute misconduct as defined by New York State Education Law

§6530(29)(McKinney Supp 2000).

I agree that in the event I am charged with professional misconduct in the future, this agreement and order shall be admitted into evidence in that proceeding.

I hereby make this Application to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct (the Board) and request that it be granted.

I understand that, in the event that this Application is not granted by the Board, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such Application shall not be used against me in any way and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the Board shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by the Board pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that, in the event the Board grants my Application, as set forth herein, an order of the Chairperson of the Board shall be issued in accordance with same. I agree that such order shall be effective upon issuance by the Board, which may be accomplished by mailing, by first class mail, a copy of the Consent Order to me at the address set forth in this agreement, or to my attorney, or upon transmission via facsimile to me or my attorney, whichever is earliest.

I am making this Application of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion or restraint of any kind or manner. In consideration of the value to me of the acceptance by the Board of this Application, allowing me to resolve this matter without the various risks and burdens, including the financial burdens of a hearing on the merits, I knowingly waive any right I may have to contest the Consent Order for which I hereby apply, whether administratively or judicially, and ask that the Application be granted.



STATEMENT
OF
CHARGES

MAGED ZAKARIA YOUSSEF AHMED, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about June 1, 1995, by the issuance of license number 119752 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- A. In response to a request to submit documentation regarding board certification to the Department of Pediatrics at Maimonides Hospital, Brooklyn, New York, the Respondent submitted a copy of what purported to be a facsimile of American Board of Pediatrics ("ABOP") certificate #051389. By said conduct, Respondent:
1. Knowingly and falsely represented that he was a diplomate of the ABOP since October 11, 1995, when, in fact, he knew that the facsimile of the ABOP certificate which he submitted was a fabrication and that he never held board certification status in pediatrics. Respondent intended to mislead.
- B. On or about September 17, 1997, the Respondent submitted a reappointment application to the St. Vincent's Medical Center of Richmond, Staten Island, New York, in which he knowingly and falsely represented that he had held board certification status in pediatrics since 1996, when, in fact, he knew that

he never held such a status. Respondent intended to mislead.

- C. On a curriculum vitae which the Respondent submitted, and/or caused to be submitted, to the Lutheran Medical Center, Brooklyn, New York, in or about July, 1998, he knowingly and falsely represented that he was board certified in pediatrics, when, in fact, he knew that he never held such a status. Respondent intended to mislead.

SPECIFICATION OF CHARGES

FRAUDULENT PRACTICE

Respondent is charged with committing professional misconduct as defined by N.Y. Educ. Law §6530(2)(McKinney Supp. 1999) by practicing the profession of medicine fraudulently as alleged in the facts of the following:

FOURTH THROUGH SIXTH SPECIFICATIONS

report, or failing to file a report required by law or by the department of health or the education department, as alleged in the facts of:

EXHIBIT "B"

Terms of Probation

1. Respondent shall conduct himself/herself in all ways in a manner befitting his/her professional status, and shall conform fully to the moral and professional standards of conduct and obligations imposed by law and by his/her profession.
 2. Respondent shall submit written notification to the New York State Department of Health addressed to the Director of the Office of Professional Medical Conduct, New York State Department of Health, 433 River Street, Suite 303, Troy, NY 12180-2299; said notice is to include a full description of any employment and practice, professional and residential addresses and telephone numbers within or without New York State, and any and all investigations, charges, convictions or disciplinary actions by any local, state or federal agency, institution or facility, within thirty days of each action.
 3. The period of probation shall be tolled during periods in which Respondent is not engaged in the active practice of medicine in New York State. Respondent shall notify the Director of OPMC, in writing, if Respondent is not currently engaged in or intends to leave the active practice of medicine in New York State for a period of thirty (30) consecutive days or more. Respondent shall then notify the Director again prior to any change in that status. The period of probation shall resume and any terms of probation which were not fulfilled shall be fulfilled upon Respondent's return to practice in New York State.
 4. Respondent's professional performance may be reviewed by the Director of OPMC. This review may include, but shall not be limited to, a review of office records, patient records and/or hospital charts, interviews with or periodic visits with Respondent and his/her staff at practice locations or OPMC offices.
 5. Respondent shall maintain legible and complete medical records which accurately reflect the evaluation and treatment of patients. The medical records shall contain all information required by State rules and regulations.
 6. Respondent shall submit for review by the Office of Professional Medical Conduct, at the address set forth in paragraph 2, all applications related to the practice of medicine that he submits to any governmental agency, hospital or other entity, including but not limited to hospital credential applications, applications for medical licensure, applications to health maintenance organizations, applications for Medicaid and Medicare privileges, applications to third party reimbursement providers. Copies of the aforementioned applications should be provided to OPMC within 30 days of the date that Respondent has submitted the application.
- COMMUNITY/PUBLIC SERVICE
7. Respondent shall perform 500 hours of community service. The service

need not be medical in nature. If the service is medical in nature, the service must be delivered in a facility or with an organization equipped to provide medical services and serving a needy or medically underserved population. A written proposal for community service must be submitted to, and is subject to the written approval of the Director of OPMC. Community service performed prior to written approval shall not be credited toward compliance with this Order. Respondent may perform community service of a non-medical nature during the period that his license is actively suspended.

8. Respondent shall comply with all terms, conditions, restrictions, limitations and penalties to which he or she is subject pursuant to the Order and shall assume and bear all costs related to compliance. Upon receipt of evidence of noncompliance with, or any violation of these terms, the Director of OPMC and/or the Board may initiate a violation of probation proceeding and/or any such other proceeding against Respondent as may be authorized pursuant to the law.
