GREGORY X. BOEHM, M.D., says:

On or about July 30, 1987, I was licensed to practice medicine as a physician in the State of New York having been issued License No. 171328 by the New York State Education Department. I currently reside at 22100 McCauley, Shaker Heights, OH 44122.

I am not currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice as a physician in the State of New York.

I understand that the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with three (3) specifications of professional misconduct as set forth in the Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A."

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for an agreement to allow me to surrender my license as a physician in the State of New York and request that the Board issue this Surrender Order.

I, hereby, agree not to contest the three (3) specifications set forth in the Statement of Charges (Exhibit A).


I understand that in the event that this proposed agreement is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such proposed agreement shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and

such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that, in the event the Board grants my Application, as set forth herein, an order of the Chairperson of the Board shall be issued in accordance with same upon issuance by the Board, which may be accomplished by mailing, by first class mail, a copy of the Order to me at the address set forth above or to my attorney or upon transmission via facsimile to me or my attorney, whichever is first.


I am making this agreement of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion or restraint of any kind of manner.



STATEMENT
OF
CHARGES

GREGORY X. BOEHM, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York state on July 30, 1987, by the issuance of license number 171328 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

A. On or about January 16, 2001, in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio, based on a plea of guilty, Respondent was found guilty of Health Care Fraud in violation of 18 U.S.C. §1347, a felony.

B. On or about July 11, 2001, the Medical Board of Ohio (hereinafter "Ohio Board"), by an Entry of Order, (hereinafter "Ohio Order"), suspended Respondent's certificate to practice medicine for one (1) year, and thereafter placed his certificate on at least five (5) years probation with terms, conditions, and limitations, based on the conviction described in Paragraph A above.

C. The conduct resulting in the Ohio Board disciplinary actions against Respondent would constitute misconduct under the laws of New York State, pursuant to the following sections of New State law:

1. New York Education Law §6530(9)(a)(ii) (being convicted of committing an act constituting a crime under federal law).

SPECIFICATIONS
FIRST SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York Education Law §6530(9)(a)(ii) by being convicted of committing an act constituting a crime under federal law, in that Petitioner charges:

1. The facts in Paragraph A.

SECOND SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York Education Law §6530(9)(b) by having been found guilty of improper professional practice or professional misconduct by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state where the conduct upon which the finding was based would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state, in that Petitioner charges:

2. The facts in paragraphs A, B, and/or C.

THIRD SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York Education Law §6530(d) by having his license to practice medicine summarily suspended or having had other disciplinary action taken after a disciplinary action was instituted by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state, where the conduct resulting in the summary suspension of his license or other disciplinary action would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state, in that Petitioner charges:

3. The facts in Paragraphs A, B, and/or C.
