

Administrative Law Judge James F. Horan drafted the Determination**

After conducting a hearing pursuant to N.Y. Pub. Health Law § 230(10)(p)(McKinney's Supp. 2003), a BPMC Committee sustained charges that the Respondent violated N. Y. Educ. Law §6530(9)(b)&(9)(d) (McKinney Supp. 2003) by engaging in conduct that resulted in disciplinary action in another state. The Committee voted to revoke the Respondent's New York Medical License. The Respondent then filed a Notice requesting that the ARB review the Committee Determination under N.Y. Pub. Health Law § 230-c (McKinney's Supp. 2003). That statute provides that the party requesting the review must perfect their review notice by submitting a brief to the ARB, with a copy to opposing counsel, thirty days after filing the Review Notice. The ARB holds that the Petitioner has failed to file a timely brief in this proceeding and we dismiss the Respondent's Notice.

The ARB received the Petitioner's Notice on October 16, 2002, meaning that the statute required the Petitioner to submit a brief by November 18, 2002 to perfect his Notice. On November 19, 2002, the ARB received a request from the Respondent for a sixty-day extension for filing a brief, due to illness in the Respondent's family. The Administrative Officer for the ARB granted that extension until January 20, 2003, with no objection from the Petitioner. The Respondent failed to file a brief by January 20, 2003, has filed no brief since and has received no further extension in filing from the ARB.

The ARB votes unanimously, therefore, to dismiss the Respondent's Review Notice and to sustain the Committee's Determination.

ORDER

NOW, based upon this Determination, the Review Board renders the following ORDER:

1. The ARB SUSTAINS the Committee's Determination.
2. The ARB DISMISSES the Petitioner's Review Notice.




