MARIANNE IDILKO WEBSTER, M.D., aka MARIANNE IDILKO CSANALDSI, M.D.,
says:

On or about February 2, 1989, I was licensed to practice medicine as a physician in the State of New York having been issued License No. 209442 by the New York State Education Department. I currently reside at [REDACTED].

I am not currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice as a physician in the State of New York.

I understand that the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with one (1) specification of professional misconduct as set forth in the Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A."

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for an agreement to allow me to surrender my license as a physician in the State of New York and request that the Board issue this Surrender Order.

I, hereby, agree not to contest the one (1) specification set forth in the Statement of Charges (Exhibit A).


I understand that in the event that this proposed agreement is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such

proposed agreement shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that, in the event the Board grants my Application, as set forth herein, an order of the Chairperson of the Board shall be issued in accordance with same upon issuance by the Board, which may be accomplished by mailing, by first class mail, a copy of the Order to me at the address set forth above or to my attorney or upon transmission via facsimile to me or my attorney, whichever is first.

I am making this agreement of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion or restraint of any kind of manner.

MARIANNE ILDIKO (IDILKO) WEBSTER, M.D., aka MARIANNE CSANALDSI WEBSTER, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York state on February 2, 1998, by the issuance of license number 209442 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

A. On or about June 25, 2002, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of State, State Board of Medicine (hereinafter "Pennsylvania Board"), by an Order of Temporary Suspension (hereinafter "Pennsylvania Order 1"), temporarily suspended Respondent's license to practice medicine, based on allegations that the continued practice of medicine by Respondent presents an immediate and clear danger to the public health and safety.

B. On or about August 5, 2002, the Pennsylvania Board, by Opinion and Order (hereinafter "Pennsylvania Order 2"), continued the temporary suspension set forth in Paragraph A above.

C. On or about November 19, 2002, the Pennsylvania Board by a Consent Agreement and Order (hereinafter "Pennsylvania Order 3"), indefinitely **SUSPENDED** Respondent's license to practice medicine for no less than five (5) years, immediately stayed the suspension in favor for no less than five (5) years of **PROBATION** with terms and conditions, based on practicing the profession while impaired by mental illness.

D. The conduct resulting in the Pennsylvania Board's disciplinary action against Respondent would constitute misconduct under the laws of New York state, pursuant to the following sections of New York state Law:


1. New York Education Law §6530(7) (practicing the profession while impaired by mental disability).

SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York Education Law §6530(9)(d) by having her license to practice medicine suspended or having other disciplinary action taken by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state, where the conduct resulting in the suspension or other disciplinary action would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws New York state, in that Petitioner charges:

1. The facts in Paragraphs A, B, C, and/or D.

ORDER


