AUBREY ANTHONY CAMACHO, M.D., says:

On or about July 26, 1989, I was licensed to practice medicine as a physician in the State of New York having been issued License No. 179191 by the New York State Education Department. I currently reside at 4740 Berkley Walk Point, Duluth, GA 30096. I am not currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice as a physician in the State of New York.

I understand that the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with one (1) specification of professional misconduct as set forth in the Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A."

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for an agreement to allow me to surrender my license as a physician in the State of New York and request that the Board issue this Surrender Order.

I, hereby, agree not to contest the one (1) Specification set forth in the Statement of Charges (Exhibit A).

I understand that, in the event that this proposed agreement is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such proposed agreement shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and

such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that, in the event the Board grants my Application, as set forth herein, an order of the Chairperson of the Board shall be issued in accordance with same upon issuance by the Board, which may be accomplished by mailing, by first class mail, a copy of the Order to me at the address set forth above, or to my attorney, or upon transmission via facsimile to me or my attorney, whichever is first.


I am making this agreement of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion, or restraint of any kind of manner.



STATEMENT
OF
CHARGES

AUBREY ANTHONY CAMACHO, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York state on July 26, 1989, by the issuance of license number 179191 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

A. On or about October 15, 2002, in the Superior Court of DeKalb County, Georgia, Respondent was found guilty, based on a plea of guilty, of Medicaid Fraud, a felony, and was sentenced to ten (10) years confinement, five (5) years in prison and the remainder to be served as probation, and 500 hours community service.

B. On or about October 16, 2002, the Georgia Composite State Board of Medical Examiners (hereinafter "Georgia Board"), by a Voluntary Surrender (hereinafter "Surrender"), accepted the Voluntary Surrender of Respondent's license to practice medicine "that shall have the same effect as a revocation," based on the criminal conviction described in Paragraph A above.

C. The conduct resulting in the Georgia disciplinary action against Respondent would constitute misconduct under the laws of New York state, pursuant to the following sections of New York state law:

1. New York Education Law §6530(9)(a)(i) being convicted of committing an act constituting a crime under a state law.

SPECIFICATIONS
FIRST SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York Education Law §6530(9)(a)(iii) by having been convicted of committing an act constituting a crime under the law of another jurisdiction and which, if committed within New York state would have constituted a crime under laws of New York state, in that Petitioner charges:


1. The facts in Paragraph A.

SECOND SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York Education Law §6530(9)(d) by having surrendered his license to practice medicine or having other disciplinary action taken by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state, where the conduct resulting in the surrender or other disciplinary action would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state, in that Petitioner charges:

2. The facts in Paragraphs A, B, and/or C.

ORDER


