AND ORDER

JACOB ZAMSTEIN, M.D., (Respondent) being duly sworn deposes and says:

That on or about November 3, 1978, I was licensed to practice as a physician in the State of New York, having been issued License No. 136715 by the New York State Education Department.

My current address is 148 Sunny Reach Drive, West Hartford, CT 06117, and I will advise the Director of the Office of Professional Medical Conduct of any change of my address.

The Commissioner's Order dated February 3, 2005, is, hereby, vacated.

I understand that the New York State Board of Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with three (3) specifications of professional misconduct.

A copy of the Statement of Charges is annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A."

I agree not to contest the three (3) specifications, in full satisfaction of the charges against me, and hereby agree to the following penalty:

Not to renew my registration to practice medicine in New York state for three (3) years; and

Three (3) years probation tolled until I return to the active practice of medicine in the State of New York.

I further agree that the Consent Order for which I, hereby, apply shall Impose the following conditions:

That Respondent shall fully cooperate in every respect with the Office of Professional Medical Conduct (OPMC) in its administration and enforcement of this Order and in its investigation of all matters regarding Respondent. Respondent shall respond in a timely manner to each and every request by OPMC to provide written periodic verification of Respondent's compliance with the terms of this Order. Respondent shall meet with a person designated by the Director of OPMC as directed. Respondent shall respond promptly and provide any and all documents and information within Respondent's control upon the direction of OPMC. This condition shall be in effect beginning upon the effective date of the Consent Order and will continue while the licensee possesses his/her license.

I, hereby, stipulate that any failure by me to comply with such conditions shall constitute misconduct as defined by New York State Education Law §6530(29).

I agree that in the event that I am charged with professional misconduct in the future, the agreement and order shall be admitted into evidence in that proceeding.

I, hereby, make this Application to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct (the Board) and request that it be granted.

I understand that, in the event that this Application is not granted by the Board, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such Application shall not be used against me in any way and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the Board shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by the Board pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that, in the event the Board grants my Application, as set forth herein, an order of the Chairperson of the Board shall be issued in accordance with same. I agree that such order shall be effective upon issuance by the Board, which may be accomplished by mailing, by first class mail, a copy of the Consent Order to me at the address set forth in this agreement, or to my attorney, or upon transmission via facsimile to me or my attorney, whichever is earliest.

I am making this Application of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion or restraint of any kind or manner. In consideration of the value to me of the acceptance by the Board of this Application, allowing me to resolve this matter without the various risks and burdens of a hearing on the merits. I knowingly waive any right I may have to contest the Consent Order for which I hereby apply, whether administratively or judicially, and ask that the Application be granted.

CHARGES

JACOB ZAMSTEIN, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice as a Physician New York state on November 3, 1978, by the issuance of license number 136715 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS --

- A. On or about June 16, 2003, in the United States District Court, District of Massachusetts, Respondent was found guilty, based on a plea of guilty, of Conspiracy to Defraud, in violation of Title 18 USC §371, a felony, and was sentenced to one (1) year probation, a \$1,000.00 fine, \$32,380.16 restitution, and a \$100.00 assessment.
- B. On or about October 19, 2004, the State of Connecticut Department of Public Health, Bureau of Healthcare Systems (hereinafter "Connecticut Board"), by a Consent Order (hereinafter "Connecticut Order"), reprimanded Respondent's license to practice as a physician and surgeon and imposed a \$3,000.00 civil penalty, based on the conviction set forth in Paragraph A, above.
- C. The conduct resulting in the Connecticut Board disciplinary action against Respondent would constitute misconduct under the lased of New York state, pursuant to the following sections of New York state law:
- 1. New York Education Law §6530(9)(a)(ii) (having been convicted of committing an act constituting a crime under federal law).

SPECIFICATIONS FIRST SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York Education Law §6530(9)(a)(ii) by having been convicted of committing an act constituting a crime under federal law, in that Petitioner charges:

1. The facts in Paragraph A.

SECOND SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York Education Law §6530(9)(b) by having been found guilty of improper professional practice or professional misconduct by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state where the conduct which the finding was based would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state, in that Petitioner charges:

2. The facts in Paragraphs A, B, and/or C.

THIRD SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York Education Law §6530(9)(d) by having disciplinary action taken by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state, where the conduct resulting in the disciplinary action would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state, in that Petitioner charges:

3. The facts in Paragraphs A, B, and/or C.

EXHIBIT B Terms of Probation

- Respondent shall conduct himself in all ways in a manner befitting his professional status, and shall conform fully to the moral and professional standards of conduct and obligations imposed by law and by his profession.
- 2. Respondent shall submit written notification to the New York State Department of Health addressed to the Director, Office of Professional Medical Conduct (OPMC), Hedley Park Place, 433 River Street Suite 303, Troy, New York 12180-2299; said notice is to include a full description of any employment and practice, professional and residential addresses and telephone numbers within or without New York State, and any and all investigations, charges, convictions or disciplinary actions by any local, state or federal agency, institution or facility, within thirty days of each action.
- Respondent shall fully cooperate with and respond in a timely manner to requests from OPMC to
 provide written periodic verification of Respondent's compliance with the terms of this Order.
 Respondent shall personally meet with a person designated by the Director of OPMC as requested
 by the Director.
- 4. Any civil penalty not paid by the date prescribed herein shall be subject to all provisions of law relating to debt collection by New York State. This includes but is not limited to the imposition of interest, late payment charges and collection fees; referral to the New York State Department of Taxation and Finance for collection; and non-renewal of permits or licenses [Tax Law section 171(27)]; State Finance Law section 18; CPLR section 5001; Executive Law section 32].
- 5. The period of probation shall be tolled during periods in which Respondent is not engaged in the active practice of medicine in New York State. Respondent shall notify the Director of OPMC, in writing, if Respondent is not currently engaged in or intends to leave the active practice of medicine in New York State for a period of thirty (30) consecutive days or more. Respondent shall then notify the Director again prior to any change in that status. The period of probation shall resume and any terms of probation which were not fulfilled shall be fulfilled upon Respondent's return to practice in New York State.
- 6. Respondent's professional performance may be reviewed by the Director of OPMC. This review may include, but shall not be limited to, a review of office records, patient records and/or hospital charts, interviews with or periodic visits with Respondent and his staff at practice locations or OPMC offices.
- Respondent shall maintain legible and complete medical records which accurately reflect the
 evaluation and treatment of patients. The medical records shall contain all information required by
 State rules and regulations regarding controlled substances.
- 8. Respondent shall comply with all terms, conditions, restrictions, limitations and penalties to which he is subject pursuant to the Order and shall assume and bear all costs related to compliance. Upon receipt of evidence of noncompliance with, or any violation of these terms, the Director of OPMC and/or the Board may initiate a violation of probation proceeding and/or any such other proceeding against Respondent as may be authorized pursuant to the law.
