That on or about February 17, 1970, I was licensed to practice as a physician in the State of New York, having been issued License No. 105467 by the New York State Education Department.

I understand that the New York State Board For Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with two (2) Specifications of professional medical misconduct, based solely upon the State of New Jersey, Department of Law & Public Safety, Division of Consumer Affairs, State Board of Medical Examiners, August 8, 2007, Final Order.

A copy of the Statement of Charges, marked as Exhibit "A," is attached to and part of this Consent Agreement.

The New York State Department of Health has offered to settle this matter by my agreeing to a Censure and Reprimand, a \$10,000.00 fine, that I fully comply with the New Jersey, Final Order, and that I keep my New York State license registration active.

As I have not practiced medicine in New York state in many years and I do not intend to return to practice medicine in New York state.

I agree not to contest Factual Allegations A and B(4) and the Second Specification, in full satisfaction of the charges against me.

I agree in lieu of the settlement offered by the State of New York:

to never activate my registration to practice medicine in New York state or seek to reapply for a license to practice medicine in New York state.

I stipulate, hereby, that any failure by me to comply with such conditions shall constitute misconduct as defined by New York State Education Law §6530(29).

I make, hereby, this Application to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct (the Board) and request that it be granted.

I understand that, in the event that this Application is not granted by the Board, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such Application shall not be used against me in any way and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the Board shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by the Board pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree, that in the event the Board grants my Application, as set forth herein, an Order of the Chairperson of the Board shall be issued in accordance with same. I agree that such order shall be effective upon issuance by the Board, which may be accomplished by mailing, by first class mail, a copy of the Consent Order to me at the address set forth in this agreement, or to my attorney, or upon transmission via facsimile to me or my attorney, whichever is earliest.

I am making this Application of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion or restraint of any kind or manner. In consideration of the value to me of the acceptance by the Board of this Application, allowing me to resolve this matter without the various risks and burdens of a hearing on the merits. I knowingly waive any right I may have to contest the Consent Order for which I hereby apply, whether administratively or judicially, and ask that the Application be granted.

PRISCILLA G. ILEM, M.D., Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York state on February 17, 1970, by the issuance of license number 105467 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- A. On or about August 8, 2007, the State of New Jersey, Department of Law & Public Safety, Division of Consumer Affairs, State Board of Medical Examiners (hereinafter "New Jersey Board"), by a Final Order (hereinafter "New Jersey Order"), inter alia, formally reprimanded Respondent ordered her to pay \$27,804.76 costs and a \$13,000.00 civil penalty, and required her to complete a medical recordkeeping course, based on illegally writing twenty three (23) prescriptions for CDS at times she did not hold and knew she did not hold a valid DEA registration and knowingly falsifying and submitting falsified medical records to a committee of the New Jersey Board, investigating her conduct.
- B. The conduct resulting in the New Jersey Board disciplinary action against Respondent would constitute misconduct under the laws of New York state, pursuant to the following sections of New York state Law:
 - 1. New York Education Law §6530(2) (practicing the profession fraudulently);
- 2. New York Education Law §6530(16) (failure to comply with substantial provisions of federal, state, or local laws, rules, or regulations governing the practice of medicine);
- 3. New York Education Law §65390(20) (moral unfitness in the practice of medicine); and/or
- 4. New York Education Law §6530(24) (practicing beyond the scope permitted by law).

SPECIFICATIONS FIRST SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York Education Law §6530(9)(b) by having been found guilty of improper professional practice or professional misconduct by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state where the conduct upon which the finding was based would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state, in that Petitioner charges:

SECOND SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York Education Law §6530(9)(d) by having her license to practice medicine revoked and/or having other disciplinary action taken by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state, where the conduct resulting in the license revocation and/or other disciplinary action would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws New York state, in that Petitioner charges:
