PETER V. CHOY, M.D., being duly sworn, deposes and says:

On or about June 3, 1977, I was licensed to practice medicine as a physician in the State of New York having been issued License No. 130763 by the New York State Education Department.

My current address is 65-19 Borden Ave., Masbeth, N.Y., and I will advise the Director of the Office of Professional Medical Conduct of any change of my address.

I understand that I have been charged with four specifications of professional misconduct as set forth in the Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A".

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for permission to surrender my license as a physician in the State of New York on the grounds that I agree not to contest the facts stated in paragraphs A and A1 and B and B1 in full satisfaction of the Statement of Charges, with such surrender to become effective on June 26, 1998.

I hereby make this application to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct and request that it be granted. I understand that, in the event that the application is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such application shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that, in the event the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct grants my application, an order shall be issued upon acceptance of this agreement, striking my name from the roster of physicians in the State of New York effective June 26, 1998, without further notice to me.

I am making this Application of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion or restraint of any kind or manner. In consideration of the value to me of the acceptance by the Board of this Application, allowing me to resolve this matter without the various risks and burdens of a hearing on the merits, I knowingly waive any right I may have to contest the Surrender Order for which I hereby apply, whether administratively or judicially, and ask that the Application be granted.

PETER V. CHOY, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about June 3, 1977, by the issuance of license number 130763 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- A. On or about December 1, 1994, Respondent wilfully submitted an application to Oxford Health Plans in which he falsely represented that he was certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine to be a diplomate in the specialty of Internal Medicine.
 - 1. Respondent knowingly made this false representation with the intention to deceive.
- B. On or about May 12, 1995, Respondent wilfully submitted an application to
 Empire Blue Cross and Blue Shield Managed Care Networks in which he
 falsely represented that he was certified by the American Board of Internal
 Medicine to be a diplomate in the specialty of Internal Medicine.
 - 1. Respondent knowingly made this false representation with the intention to deceive.

SPECIFICATION OF CHARGES
