**COMMISSIONER'S
SUMMARY
ORDER**

TO: RONALD A. KURYLOWICZ, D.O.

The undersigned, Richard F. Daines, M.D., Commissioner of Health, pursuant to New York Public Health Law §230, upon the recommendation of a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct of the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, has determined that the duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another jurisdiction, the Osteopathic Medical Board of California, Department of Consumer Affairs, State of California (hereinafter "California Board"), has made a finding substantially equivalent to a finding that the practice of medicine by **RONALD A. KURYLOWICZ, D.O.**, Respondent, New York license number 126038, in that jurisdiction, constitutes an imminent danger to the health of its people, as is more fully set forth in the Interim Suspension Order, dated December 15, 2006, attached, hereto, as Appendix "A," and made a part, hereof.

It is, therefore:

ORDERED, pursuant to New York Public Health Law §230(12)(b), that effective immediately, **RONALD A. KURYLOWICZ, D.O.** shall not practice medicine in the State of New York or in any other jurisdiction where that practice is predicated on a valid New York State license to practice medicine.

Any practice of medicine in the State of New York in violation of this Order shall constitute Professional Misconduct within the meaning of New York Education Law §6530(29) and may constitute unauthorized medical practice, a Felony defined by New York Education Law §6512.

This Order shall remain in effect until the final conclusion of a hearing which shall commence within thirty (30) days after the final conclusion of the disciplinary proceeding in California.

The hearing will be held pursuant to the provisions of New York Public Health Law §230, and New York State Administrative Procedure Act §§301-307 and 401. The hearing will be conducted before a committee on professional conduct of the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct on a date and at a location to be set forth in a written Notice of Referral Proceeding to be provided to the Respondent after the final conclusion of the California proceeding. Said written Notice may be provided in person, by mail, or by other means. If Respondent wishes to be provided said written notice at an address other than that set forth above, Respondent shall so notify, in writing, both the attorney whose name is set forth in this Order, and the Director of the Office of Professional Medical Conduct, at the addresses set forth below.

Respondent shall notify the Director of the Office of Professional Medical Conduct, New York State Department of Health, 433 River Street, Suite 303, Troy, NY 12180-2299, via Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, of the final conclusion of the proceeding immediately upon such conclusion. -

These proceedings may result in a determination that your license to practice medicine in New York State be revoked or suspended and/or that you be fined or subject to other sanctions set forth in New York Public Health Law §230-a. You are urged to obtain an attorney to represent you in this matter.

INTERIM SUSPENSION ORDER

On November 14, 2006, Petitioner Donald J. Krpan (Petitioner), Executive Director of the Osteopathic Medical Board of California (Board), acting in his official capacity, filed a Petition for Interim Suspension Order (Petition), pursuant to Government Code section 11529, seeking to suspend the osteopathic physician and surgeon's certificate issued to Respondent Ronald A. Kurylowicz, D.O. (Respondent). The Petition was assigned to Julie Cabos-Owen, Administrative Law Judge with the Office of Administrative Hearings, at Los Angeles, California, who read and considered the Petition, declarations and points and authorities filed in support thereof and the declarations filed in opposition.

The noticed hearing was held and argument was heard on December 15, 2006. Adrian K. Panton, Deputy Attorney General, represented Petitioner. Abbie P. Maliniak of BOND CURTIS, L.L.P., represented Respondent.¹

At the hearing of the Petition, the parties stipulated to the issuance of the Interim Suspension Order.

The Administrative Law Judge, having read and considered all papers filed in support of the Petition and having heard argument of counsel, now makes the following orders:

1. Pursuant to the stipulation of the parties, the Petition for Interim Suspension Order is granted.

2. Subject to the provisions of Government Code section 11529, Osteopathic Physician and Surgeon License Number 20A4555, issued to Respondent Ronald A. Kuryłowicz, D.O., is suspended, pending a final determination by the Osteopathic Medical Board of California on any Accusation filed against Respondent.

3. During the time this Interim Suspension Order is in effect:

(a) Respondent is prohibited from practicing any aspect of osteopathic medicine in the State of California;

(b) Respondent shall not advertise himself, by any means, or hold himself out as practicing or being available to practice any system or mode of treating the sick or afflicted in this State;

(c) Respondent shall not supervise any osteopathic assistants;

(d) Respondent shall not be present in any location or office which is maintained for the practice of osteopathic medicine, or at which osteopathic medicine is practiced, for any purpose except as a patient or as visitor of family and friends, and except that he may be present at his home, which is the location where, prior to this interim suspension, Respondent had practiced osteopathic medicine.

4. Respondent shall surrender to his attorneys, who shall in turn immediately surrender to the Osteopathic Medical Board of California or its agent for safekeeping pending a final administrative order, all indicia of licensure as an osteopathic physician and surgeon, including his wall certificate and his wallet card.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
