NORMAN COHEN, D.O., being duly sworn, deposes and says: That on or about August 10, 1953, I was licensed to practice as a physician in the State of New York, having been issued License No. 073987 by the New York State Education Department.

I am currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice as a physician in the State of New York for the period January 1, 1989 through December 31, 1991 from Straight Path Prof. Group, P.C., 900 Straight Path, W. Babylon, New York 11704.

I understand that the New York State Board of Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with six Specifications of professional misconduct.

A copy of the Statement of Charges is annexed hereto, made a part hereof, arl marked as Exhibit "A".

For purposes of this proceeding only, I do not contest the factual allegations set forth in paragraph A of the Statement of Charges, but I deny the factual allegations set forth in paragraph B of the Statement of Charges. For purposes of this proceeding only, I do not contest the First Specification, Willfully Abusing a Patient Physically, (as set forth in paragraph 1); I do not contest the Third Specification, Practicing the Profession Fraudulently, (as set forth in paragraph 3); and I do not contest the Fifth Specification, Moral Unfitness, (as set forth in paragraph 5); I do not admit the Second Specification, Willfully Abusing a Patient Physically, (as set forth in paragraph 2); I do not admit the Fourth Specification, Practicing the Profession Fraudulently, (as set forth in paragraph 4); and I do not admit the Sixth Specification, Moral Unfitness, (as set forth in paragraph 6); in full satisfaction of all the specifications of professional misconduct.

I hereby agree to the penalty that my license to practice as a physician in the State of New York be suspended for a period of three (3) years, that the first six (6) months of the suspension be actual, that execution of the last two and one-half (2 1/2) years of said suspension be stayed, at which

time I then be placed on probation for said last two and one-half (2 1/2) years under the terms set forth in the exhibit annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "B".

I hereby make this application to the Board of Regents and request that it be granted.

I understand that, in the event that this application is not granted by the Board of Regents, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such application shall not be used against me in any way and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the Board of Regents shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by the Board of Regents pursuant to the provisions of the Education Law.

I agree that, in the event the Board of Regents grants my application, as set forth herein, an order of the Commissioner of Education may be issued in accordance with same.

No promises of any kind were made to me. I am making this application of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion or restraint of any kind or manner.

NORMAN COHEN, D.O., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on August 10, 1953 by the issuance of license number 073987 by the New York State Education Department. The Respondent is currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice medicine for the period January 1, 1989 through December 31, 1991 at Straight Path Prof. Group, P.C., 900 Straight Path, W. Babylon, New York 11704.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

A. On or about August 5, 1986, at Respondent's office, Respondent, during the course of an examination of Patient A, purportedly for treatment of Patient A's stomach pain, manipulated Patient A's vagina and breasts. (Patient A's name and all other names appear in the attached Appendix).

B. On or about April 27, 1987 at Respondent's office, Respondent, during the course of an examination of Patient B,

purportedly for treatment of Patient B's cut finger, manipulated Patient B's breast and kissed her.

SPECIFICATION OF CHARGES

FIRST AND SECOND SPECIFICATIONS

WILLLFULLY ABUSING A PATIENT PHYSICALLY

The Respondent is charged with committing unprofessional conduct under N.Y. Educ. Law, Section 6509(9) (McKinney 1985) and his conduct in the practice of his profession evidences unprofessional conduct within the meaning of 8 N.Y.C.R.R. 29.2(a)(2)(1984) by willfully abusing a patient physically, in that, the Petitioner charges:

THIRD AND FOURTH SPECIFICATION

PRACTICING THE PROFESSION FRAUDULENTLY

The Respondent is charged with practicing the profession of medicine fraudulently under N.Y. Educ. Law, Section 6509(2) (McKinney 1985) in that the Petitioner charges:

FIFTH AND SIXTH SPECIFICATION

MORAL UNFITNESS

The Respondent is charged with committing unprofessional conduct under N.Y. Educ. Law, Section 6509(9) (McKinney 1985) and his conduct in the practice of his profession evidences unprofessional conduct within the meaning of 8 N.Y.C.R.R. 29.1(b)(5)(1984) by engaging in conduct in the practice of medicine which evidences moral unfitness to practice the profession, in that the Petitioner charges:

TERMS OF PROBATION

- That Respondent, during the period of probation, shall conduct himself in all ways in a manner befitting his professional status, and shall conform fully to the moral and professional standards of conduct imposed by law and by his profession;
- 2. That Respondent shall submit written notification to the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH), addressed to the Director, Office of Professional Medical Conduct, New York State Health Department, Empire State Plaza, Tower Building, Albany, New York 12237 of any employment and practice, of Respondent's residence and telephone number, of any change in respondent's employment, practice, residence, or telephone number within or without the State of New York;
- 3. Respondent shall submit written proof from the Division of Professional Licensing Services (DPLS), New York State Education Department (NYSED), that respondent has paid all registration fees due and owing to the NYSED and Respondent shall cooperate with and submit whatever papers are requested by DPLS in regard to said registration fees, said proof from DPLS to be submitted by Respondent to the New York State Department of Health, addressed to the Director, Office of Professional Medical Conduct, as aforesaid, no later than the first three months of the period of probation;

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- 4. Respondent shall submit written proof to the NYSDOH, addressed to the Director, Office of Professional Medical Conduct, as aforesaid, 1) Respondent is currently registered with the NYSED, unless Respondent submits written proof that Respondent has advised DPLS, NYSED, that Respondent is not engaging in the practice of Respondent's profession in the State of New York and does not desire to register, and that 2) Respondent has paid any fines which may have previously been imposed upon respondent by the Board of Regents; said proof of the above to be submitted no later than the first two months of the period of probation;
- 5. So long as there is full compliance with every term herein set forth, Respondent may continue to practice his aforementioned profession in accordance with the terms of probation; provided, however, that upon receipt of evidence

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of noncompliance with or any other violation of probation,* proceeding and/or such other proceeding may be initiated against Respondent pursuant to the Education Law, Rules of the Board of Regents and/or Public Health Law.
