It appearing that the limited licenses of SAMIR BOUTROS, to practice as a physician in the State of New York, was surrendered by Order of the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct dated August 12, 2004, and he having petitioned the Board of Regents for restoration of said license, and the Regents having given consideration to said petition and having reviewed the record, and having disagreed with and rejected the recommendation of the Peer Committee and having agreed with and accepted the recommendations of the majority of the Committee on the Professions, now, pursuant to action taken by the Board of Regents on June 21, 2011, it is hereby

ORDERED that the petition for restoration of Limited License No. 002016, authorizing SAMIR BOUTROS to practice as a physician in the State of New York, is denied; but that after he has presented proof to the Director of the Office of Professional Medical Conduct that he has fulfilled the requirements of Education Law §6524 so as to continue to qualify for licensure and registration under that statute, the execution of the Order of surrender of said license is stayed; said SAMIR BOUTROS will be placed on probation for a period of two years under specified terms and conditions; and upon successful completion of the probationary period, his limited

license to practice as a physician in the State of New York shall be fully restored consistent with the provisions of Education Law §6524.

TERMS OF PROBATION  
COMMITTEE ON THE PROFESSIONS

Re: **Samir Boutros**

1. That applicant, during the period of probation, shall be in compliance with the standards of conduct prescribed by the law governing applicant's profession;
2. That any and all physical examinations of female patients conducted by applicant, during the period of probation, shall be conducted in the presence of a chaperone selected in accordance with procedures approved by the Director, Office of Professional Medical Conduct;
3. That applicant shall submit written notification to the Director, Office of Professional Medical Conduct (OPMC), 433 River Street, Suite 303, Troy, New York 12180-2299, within 15 days of receipt of this Order, of any employment and/or practice, applicant's residence, telephone number, and mailing address, and of any change in applicant's employment, practice, residence, telephone number, and mailing address within or without the State of New York;
4. That applicant shall submit written proof from the Division of Professional Licensing Services (DPLS), New York State Education Department (NYSED), that applicant has paid all registration fees due and owing to the NYSED and applicant shall cooperate with and submit whatever papers are requested by DPLS in regard to said registration fees, said proof from DPLS to be submitted by applicant to the Department of Health (DOH), addressed to the Director, OPMC, as aforesaid, no later than the first three months of the period of probation;
5. That applicant shall submit written proof to the DOH, addressed to the Director, OPMC, as aforesaid, that 1) applicant is currently registered with the NYSED, unless applicant submits written proof that applicant has advised DPLS, NYSED, that applicant is not engaging in the practice of applicant's profession in the State of New York and does not desire to register, and that 2) applicant has paid any fines which may have previously been imposed upon applicant by the Board of Regents or pursuant to section 230-a of the Public Health Law, said proof of the above to be submitted no later than the first two months of the period of probation;
6. That applicant shall make quarterly visits to an employee of the OPMC, DOH, unless otherwise agreed to by said employee, for the purpose of said employee monitoring applicant's terms of probation to assure compliance therewith, and applicant shall cooperate with said employee, including the submission of information requested by said employee, regarding the aforesaid monitoring;
7. That the period of probation shall be tolled during periods in which the applicant is not currently engaged in the practice of medicine in New York State. The applicant shall notify the Director of OPMC, in writing, if he is not engaged in or intends to leave the active practice of medicine in New York State for a period of thirty (30) consecutive days or more. He shall then notify the Director again prior to any change in that status. The period of probation shall resume and any terms of

probation which were not fulfilled shall be fulfilled upon the applicant's return to practice in New York State; and

8. That upon receipt of evidence of noncompliance with or any other violation of any of the aforementioned terms of probation, the OPMC may initiate a violation of probation proceeding.
