These charges are only allegations which may be contested by the licensee in an Administrative hearing.

CHARGES

CYNTHIA MALY CADET, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about April 11, 2000, by the Issuance of Ilcense number 217153 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

A. On or about July 30, 2013, in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida, Respondent was found guilty of conspiracy to commit money laundering, a fetony offense under federal law. On or about April 4, 2014, Respondent was sentenced to a term of 78-months imprisonment, in total, to be followed by 2-years supervised release, payment of an assessment, and additional conditions. Among those additional conditions was a requirement that "Upon request of the appropriate regulatory agency, the defendant shall relinquish his/her license to said agency. The defendant is on notice that such relinquishment is permanent and will be considered disciplinary action."
